SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture:

According to Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 (CLP), the product is not classified as hazardous.

SECTION 3: COMPOSITION/INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

3.1. Substance:

Not applicable.

3.2. Mixtures:

Chemical description:

Aqueous mixture based on fatty alcohols, surfactants and perfume.

Components:

According to Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 (CLP), the product is not classified as hazardous.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. General information:

4.2. Description of first aid measures:

Symptoms resulting from intoxication may appear after exposure; therefore, in case of doubt, direct exposure to the chemical product or persistence of discomfort, seek medical attention, showing this safety data sheet.

- **Inhalation:**

This product does not contain substances classified as hazardous by inhalation. However, if symptoms of intoxication appear, remove the affected person from the exposure area and provide fresh air. Seek medical attention if symptoms worsen or persist.

- **Ingestion/aspiration:**

Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, keep the head tilted forward to avoid aspiration. Keep the affected person at rest. Rinse mouth and throat, as these may have been affected by ingestion.

4.4. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed:

SECTION 5: FIREFIGHTING MEASURES

5.1. Extinguishing media:

Suitable extinguishing media:

Non-flammable product under normal conditions of storage, handling and use. In case of fire resulting from improper handling, storage or use, use preferably multipurpose powder extinguishers (ABC powder), in accordance with the Regulation on fire protection installations (Royal Decree 513/2017 and subsequent amendments).

Unsuitable extinguishing media: Not relevant.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture:

As a consequence of combustion or thermal decomposition, no reaction by-products that may be highly toxic are generated and, consequently, they may not present a high risk to health.

5.3. Advice for firefighters:

Depending on the magnitude of the fire, the use of full protective clothing and self-contained breathing apparatus may be necessary. Additional provisions:

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:

For non-emergency personnel:

Isolate leaks whenever this does not pose an additional risk for the persons performing this task. In case of potential exposure to the spilled product, the use of personal protective equipment is mandatory (see Section 8). Evacuate the area and keep unprotected people away.

For emergency responders:

Wear appropriate protective equipment. Keep unprotected people away. See Section 8.

6.2. Environmental precautions:

Avoid any discharge into the aquatic environment. Properly contain the absorbed/collected product in sealed, hermetic containers. Notify the competent authority in case of exposure to the general public or the environment.

7.1. Precautions for safe handling:

A. General precautions
